TABBY or TORTIE POINT BIRMAN KITTEN 6-9 months FEMALE

Very pleasant and quiet manner. Expressive eyes. Broad head, good medium ears, sound lilac. Full cheeks, level bite, quite good chin depth. Profile dip a little shallow. Eyes clear soft blue, good shape and set, very aware of surroundings. Body and limbs very good for a girl – feminine but definitely sturdy. Sound through the middle. Tail long, full, even paler lilac, excellent ears, solid mask, spectacles. Coat of excellent soft, silky texture, dense, off-white magnolia, absolutely even. Low, scallopy gloves, short socks, long full gauntlets. A mature young lady, well turned out.

1 Attley's SYRALETTE SUGAR 'N' SPICE

An eight month old lilac tabby girl with good type and who had a broad head, well rounded with ears of medium size placed well apart. The face had good width and she had a correct dip in profile with a slight bump at the nose tip and a lilac pink tabby nose leather. Plenty of width to cheeks and showing spotted whisker pads. The chin was firm and she had large eyes that were almost round in shape and had excellent deep blue eye colour and circled with pale spectacles. The mask was still developing and was a pleasing lilac shade over a pale beige ground and was matching the other points well although her tail was a little paler. The coat was a lovely off white magnolia shade and was very soft with a silky texture while the tail was of medium length and was well furnished. Pleasing birman body shape that was well grown, firm and set on strong legs. Tabby markings were visible with an 'M' on her forehead and faint barring on the legs. The gloves were clean and white and were a little low set but the sock and gauntlets were well matched and symmetrical. Sweet kitten with a promising future.
